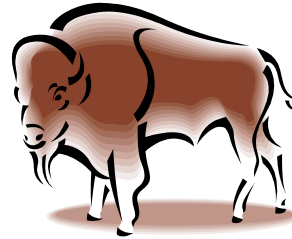

**How much additional money is being requested?**

--\$450,000 per year for three years starting in 2018-2019

**Why do we need to do this referendum now?**

--Almost \$1 million of cuts in past six years—nearly 10% of general budget

**Will there be community meetings to discuss the referendum?**

Yes. Meetings are scheduled in the Middle/High School IMC for the following dates and times:

**What will the additional funds be used for?**

- maintain current instructional programs
- continue integration & maintenance of technology resources into our students' classrooms
- maintaining facilities & grounds.

--Budget cuts have come from:

- \*changes in employee health insurances and benefit plans,
- \*eliminations or reductions in employee post-employment benefits,
- \*postponement of upgrades to materials and equipment, and
- \*attrition.

**What impact will the referendum have on my taxes?**

--mill rates are projected to be the same or lower in three years than they were in 2017-2018.

--Further declines in state aid are projected. The amount of aid received from the State has declined over \$1.1 million over the last 7 years. Without additional funds, a balanced budget for 2018-2019 will require:
