NOTE: Your child must be entering 5-year-old Kindergarten in the Fall to begin lessons in Water Exploration. Class size will depend on the number of lifeguards available and will be a ratio of two children per one lifeguard. Entry into the class will be determined on a first-come, first-serve basis.

NOTE:

- Toddler season passes are for children not old enough to take lessons.
- Only members residing at the same address can be included on a family pass.

NOTE: Please remember that all rules are in effect to protect the safety of all those who use the pool as well as to comply with State Codes.

General Rules

- People with a communicable disease, open sores, wounds, and/or cuts **cannot** be allowed in the pool.
- Shower before entering the pool and after the use of toilet facilities.
- Children under 8 years old and those unable to touch/swim without assistance in the big pool, must be accompanied by a person 14 years of age or older.
- Glass containers are **not** allowed inside the locker rooms or fenced pool area.
- Food and beverage may be enjoyed on the grass or on the pool deck area away from the water. Please stay behind the yellow line while enjoying your food and drink.
- Tobacco and alcoholic products are **not** permitted at the pool or anywhere on school grounds.
- Abusive, offensive, or profane language will **not** be permitted.
- Pets are **not** allowed inside the fenced pool area.

Pool Rules

- Only children 7 years of age or younger are allowed to swim in the baby pool. It is also important to remember that because there is no lifeguard on duty in the baby pool all children using this pool must be directly supervised by a person 14 years of age or older. If you need assistance, please ask a lifeguard.
- Infants and small children requiring diapers and using the baby pool or the large pool **must** wear swimmer diapers (available at the front desk for \$0.50) or plastic or rubber pants with elastic legs over their diapers.
- Personal lifejackets are allowed in all areas of the pool. Other floatation devices or swimming aids can be used in the shallow end of the pool only.
REMEMBER: Children should never be left unsupervised in or near water even if they are wearing a swimming aid. These devices are only to be used under the direct supervision of an adult.
- To avoid choking, we **cannot** allow anyone to chew gum in the pool.
- For sanitary reasons, spitting water, blowing noses, etc. **cannot** be allowed in the pool.
- Running, pushing, or wrestling in or about the pool area or locker rooms is **not** permitted.
- Swim fins and masks can be used in all areas of the pool except on the diving boards.
- Soft toys such as swoosh balls may be used in the pool.
- To avoid mistreatment of property, we ask that you do **not** hang on the ropes or diving boards.
- Flips and back dives off the edge of the pool **cannot** be permitted.
- Please use ladders for entering and exiting the pool only.
- Any person who has not demonstrated sufficient ability to swim in the deeper areas of the pool will be asked to pass a "Deep Water Test" before being allowed to use the deeper areas. (Please ask a lifeguard during a scheduled break)
- The School District of Mondovi and the Mondovi Swimming Pool are not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged personal property used or left at the pool.

Diving Board Rules

- One person is allowed on the diving board at a time.
- One bounce is allowed on the board.
- Sitting on the board is not allowed.
- Running on the board is not allowed.
- Go straight off the end of the board.
- Swim to the nearest ladder.
- If a stunt off the board looks dangerous to a lifeguard, the lifeguard may not permit the stunt to be performed again for safety reasons.

NOTE: When the orange cones are placed on the boards, this means that they are closed to allow open swimming in the deepest area of the pool.

Behavior Plan

1. First offense: verbal warning/reminder that their action is not acceptable
2. Second offense: Child will be “benched” or asked to take a break until the next guard rotation or when the guard has a chance to discuss the behavior with the child
3. Third offense: Child will be asked to leave the pool for the day after discussing their behavior with a guard

***These are general guidelines for rule infractions. Actual order and length of consequences are left to guard discretion based on the severity of the offenses.

The pool may close under the following conditions:

- When the air temperature is less than 60 degrees F.
- In the occurrence of an electrical storm (thunder and/or lightning) the pool will remain closed for a minimum of 30 minutes, from the last occurrence, to make sure conditions are safe.
- In cases where fecal matter and/or vomit are found in the pool water we will need to close in order to decontaminate the water.
